NOMINATION AND APPLICATION PROCEDURE		
Nomination Deadline	May 1st	November 1st
Nomination Procedure (by home institution)	<p>Before applying, the international student should, firstly, check if there is an existing partnership between Bordeaux INP and the Home Institution establishing an academic or double degree exchange. If so, they should seek the authorization from their Home Institution.</p> <p>The Home institution must nominate their students by email with the following student's information : full name, email address, field & current year of study and desired Bordeaux INP School.</p>	

Application Deadline	May 15th	November 15th
Application Procedure (by student)	Once the international student has been nominated by their Home Institution, we will send them an email with information about registration and the application instructions, together with the online application link.	
Application Documents (provided by the student)	<p>The following documents must be uploaded by the student when applying online:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - A resume (in French or in English) - A copy of their passport or identity card - A cover letter (in French or in English) - Their last Academic transcript of records - Their Learning Agreement - A Proof of language proficiency (French B1 recommended) <p>Be aware that additional documents may be asked during the enrolment process depending on the intended School.</p>	
Acceptance	The International Relations Office will send by email a "Letter of Acceptance" to the student within 3 weeks after online application deadline.

Courses Choice	<p>Before the start of their academic exchange at one of Bordeaux INP's School, prospective students must choose the courses they are willing to follow and seek its recognition from the academic advisors at their home university as well as at the receiving university.</p> <p>Confirmation of the choice of courses/modules must be done at their arrival, depending on the availability of courses and the authorisation of the programme director.</p>
International Coordinator	Students can contact the International Relations Office to agree on the selected courses before applying online.
Short Explanation of studies in France	<p>At Bordeaux INP,</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • the 1st Year equates to the 3rd Year of Bachelor • the 2nd Year equates to the 1st Year of Master. • the 3rd Year equates to the 2nd Year of Master. <p>For more information, please consult the following link.</p> <p>Each semester, a maximum of 30 ECTS are given.</p>
Language Requirements	Most of our courses are taught in French. If international students would like to follow courses in French, they are required to take a language test in French upon

	<p>arrival. So, it is recommended to have a B1 Level in French according the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFRL).</p> <p>However, some fields have English-taught courses. Do not hesitate to contact the International Relation Office. In that case, a B2 level is recommended. A proof of language proficiency in English might be asked depending on the School.</p>
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PRACTICAL INFORMATION	
Visa	<p>Students from a member state of the European Union or European Economic Area, or Switzerland, do not need a visa to reside in France during their academic exchange.</p> <p>However, students who are not from a member state of the European Union or European Economic Area, or Switzerland, need to follow a visa procedure.</p> <p>Depending on the nationality, the situation and the length of the stay, the student may be able to obtain a visa to study, to do an internship or conduct research in France.</p> <p>For more information about visas, please check :</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Campus France website for more information regarding the different types of visas. • The official French visa application website : france-visas.gouv.fr.
Accommodation - CROUS	<p>It is possible for an international student to get a CROUS accomodation. The provided accommodation is a room in a CROUS dormitory or a studio in a CROUS residence. But be aware that the CROUS has a limited number of rooms reserved for exchange students. We cannot fully guarantee a room. So, students are strongly advised to do their accommodation research well in advance. Also, they should only book their accommodation after having received their official admission letter.</p> <p>More detailed information will be sent with the acceptance letter.</p> <p>For assistance, please contact the International Relation Office.</p>
Health Insurance	<p>International students need to register on the Ameli (Assurance Maladie) website in order to be covered for their medical expenses, except if he has a European health insurance card.
